Ryan Place Residents,

I hope this letter finds you well and you are enjoying the beautiful spring weather! A far cry from what we had just a couple of months ago! Things are starting to open up as we cautiously come out of the pandemic and more folks get the vaccine ... and Ryan Place is no different!

Last month the board approved a gathering at Daggett Park for May 1. This event typically is a fundraiser of sorts for the neighborhood and coincides with voting day for local elections. We normally serve food at this event but this year we will abstain just to be extra safe. We will be providing entertainment, the Kona Ice truck for the kids, and "Lightning" may make an appearance as well. Lightning has been in the stable since our last party in 2019, but I'm sure he is ready to giddyup! The fantastic band the "Basement Apes" will play a few sets between 4-7 p.m. Since this is a fundraiser for the neighborhood, we have partnered with SportsWear Graphics to produce Ryan Place T-shirts for adults and kids. Hats

will be available as well. A portion of the proceeds will go back into the neighborhood. Each shirt will have a 2021 designation and we hope to make this a yearly event. There will be a link for ordering on Facebook and we will also send it out by Constant Contact. (If you are not on Constant Contact, please visit the Ryan Place website to sign up.) You will need to order a T-shirt or hat by Sunday, April 25, at midnight. SportsWear Graphics will email you when orders are ready to be picked up, otherwise you can pick up at the park on May 1.

All future events are being evaluated right now, but we are planning on moving ahead with the July Fourth parade. The Fairmount softball game will be postponed for one more year.

FYI – Mentioning this again! In case you weren't aware, the neighborhood owns a 1932 fire truck that for years made appearances in the July Fourth parade and other events. Did you know Ryan Place owns an antique firetruck? Well, we do! It has been repaired and restored recently at significant cost, but we need neighbors' help to keep it.


We need:

- **a** We can also use the firetruck during the Candlelight Christmas in Ryan Place Home Tour!



The following remembrance was written by our daughter, Elizabeth, about their family cat, "Cubs." In 2009 Elizabeth and her family moved to London and Great Britain's pet immigration issues made relocating cats to Texas the best choice. He and his good friend, Chucka, came to Ryan Place via an American Airlines flight out of LaGuardia Airport, New York City. As it turned out two cats from Brooklyn were a good match for Texas and Ryan Place. For six years we took care of Elizabeth's family's cats and the use of her Honda Pilot until about the time of "Brexit" when they left London for the enhanced opportunities of Texas.

Cubs was a very fine cat.

He came to us through a friend at the Brooklyn Ale House. I think the guy showed us a pic on his phone of this tiny black cat. We needed a friend for Chucka, They became best friends.

Chucka mothered Cubs. Cubs loved it.

He was all black except for a spot on his chest and maybe his boy parts.

When we got him the vet said "he's a fine specimen, almost purebred."

He was very athletic: He could jump from the ground to the roof at our cottage in Brooklyn.

He was extremely long with a lovely long tail.

He once caught a bird in Brooklyn that had a hooked beak.

He loved us unconditionally for 20 years. (As long as you would give him pats as he passed by.)

He loved the garden and being outside, even in the snow!

He will be missed.

Remembering Neighbor Robert Ross King (1940-2021) Carol King, Columnist

Robert Ross King died peacefully at home on Wednesday, March 3, 2021, holding the hand of his wife, Carol. Ross had had a series of strokes in recent years and died following a period of illness.

Ross was born in Port Arthur, Texas, to Wilna and Jesse King on February 18, 1940. By becoming an organ builder, Ross succeeded in melding his early mechanical abilities and interest in electronics with his more gradually developing devotion to music. He prepared with music degrees from North Texas State University and Union Theological Seminary in New York City, and an apprenticeship with Otto Hofmann in Austin, Texas.

In 1969, he moved his family to Fort Worth, and, in partnership with his wife as business manager, he began his own business. In 50 plus years, the firm built some 44 organs and maintained, serviced, and upgraded pipe organs throughout Texas and elsewhere. Ross participated in organizations for and wrote for publications of interest to the organ world and more recently formalized his vast knowledge of organ matters in his Handbook for Organists, Organ Committees, and Organ Builders.

Ross loved nature, camping, museums, and his neighborhood. His friends valued his curiosity, his erudite conversation, and his wry humor. He was a proud progressive and cared deeply for our freedoms. Aware of his family's immigration to America in 1656, he sought to share America's welcome with others making the same transition.

Ross loved his family. He is survived by his spouse, Carol Roland King; his three sons—David Barteld King (Patti Jeannette King), Michael Robert King (Melissa Gelman King), and Charles Edward Harrison (Amy Elizabeth King); six grandchildren; two greatgrandchildren; his sister Martha King Brockway; nine nieces and nephews; and four cousins. He was preceded in death by his sister Marilyn Warren.

Ross' body has been donated to the University of North Texas Health Science Center. A memorial service is being planned that will feature one of his pipe organs. (Inquiries may be directed to Ross_ King_Co@yahoo.com.)

A Bridge Completed


